England.

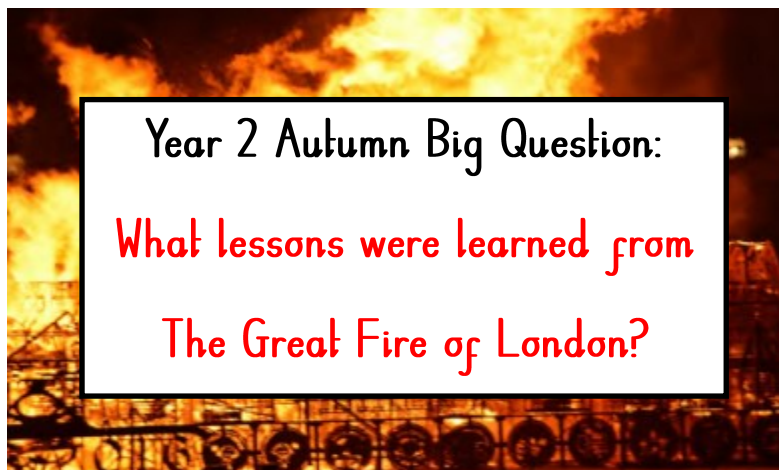
Pudding Lane	Where the fire started in a bakery.
The Tower of London	Many people kept their belongings safe here.
The River Thames	The river running through London.
St Paul's Cathedral	Was burnt down during the fire. It was redesigned by Sir Christopher Wren.

## Important people

Samuel Pepys	Reported the fire to the King. He also kept a diary of the great fire events.
Charles II	The king at the time.
Thomas Farriner	Owned the bakery where the fire started.
Sir Christopher Wren	The architect that redesigned London after the fire.

Source	A place, person, or thing from which something comes from.
Citizen	A person who lives in a particular place.
Eye-witness	A person who has seen something happen and can give a first-hand description of it.
Monarchy	The monarch and royal family of a country.
Settlement	A settlement is a place where humans are living. This can be the smallest house to the largest city.
