















We have drinks time after play where children can have milk if it has been ordered for them on the school grid.

Our afternoons will build up to include 2 or 3 sessions that will include these subjects. We also have our snack in the afternoon.






























Topics this term

In Art we are learning about primary and secondary colours as well as famous artist who have used these colours.




Materials

Toys have changed over the years in the way they looked and what they were made from. Looking at what a toy is made from can help work out how old it is.




In the past toys were often made from wood or metal. Today toys are often made of plastic.

Reading Books


- Towards the end of each week, your child will be issued an e-book on Collins e-books. The log ins for this are in the children's reading diaries.

- The children will also bring home a class library book for you to share and enjoy together, with no expectation for them to read this independently. This will sometimes be a reading passport book.




Reading Passports

- There will be a reward at the end of the year for children who have read every book on their passport.
























Spellings



Handwriting

- We shall be following the Kinetic Letters scheme.
- The letters are split into 'families' with similar formation. These all have a story to help the children remember.
- Each letter is formed either by the brave monkey or the scared monkey.



PE, Forest Time and Balance-ability

- Forest time will be on a <u>Wednesday afternoon</u>. Children must be dressed in long sleeves, long trousers (navy or black) and appropriate footwear.
- PE will be on a <u>Thursday afternoon</u>. No jewellery is to be worn and long hair should be tied back. P.E kits are to be worn all day. Please ensure all uniform is clearly labelled.

 Balance-ability is on <u>Monday mornings</u>. The children start on balance bikes with the aim of moving on to peddle bikes. Children must be dressed in long trousers and trainers with a school top and jumper. Birch class has already started. Beech class will have a go after half term.
