

What do we learn about in Year 3?

- In English this term, we will start off by learning about the place value of grammar and punctuation. This will involve lots of practise to ensure the children are confident with basic skills before moving on to studying different genres, such as:
- Non-chronological reports based on pre-historic creatures
- Recounts linked to the text Stone Age Boy
- Instructions linked to the text How to wash a woolly mammoth
- In our whole class Guided Reading sessions, we will be reading Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl and The Iron Man by Ted Hughes.



What do we learn about in Year 3?



All year groups at Hurst Green follow the White Rose Scheme of work.

In order to support your child with maths, daily times table practise is highly recommended.

What do we learn about in Year 3?

In other subjects, this term we are studying:

Science = Animals including humans; Rocks and Soils

Art / DT = Prehistoric Art / Roundhouses

History = Stone Age to Iron Age - Prehistory

PE = Dance and Baskelball

RE = Hinduism / Nativity

PSHE = Being Me in My World / Celebrating Difference

Music = Appreciation of a wide variety of music styles

French = Greetings; Alphabet

Knowledge Organisers and Quizzes

- At the beginning of each new topic (we have one per term), your child will have a new knowledge organiser. They will stick a copy into their topic books. A copy will also be available to view/print at home via the school website.
- The knowledge organiser just provides some starter knowledge for different areas of the topic and also helps the children to recap what they've already learned. It also provides them with lots of useful vocabulary.
- Children should be reading their knowledge organiser regularly to support them with their work and to help them to retain the information in their long-term memory.
- Most weeks, you will receive a message to inform you about what we will be learning in the next lesson and asking you to look
 through this information on the knowledge organiser with your child.
- At the beginning of the lesson, children will take part in a short quiz. It will consist of some recall questions about things they
 have previously learned and some questions about their upcoming learning, based on what they read on the knowledge organiser.
 This really helps the children to retain the information they have learned.

PF

- Our PE days will be Tuesdays and Fridays this term.
- Our PE lessons will be taking place both indoors and outdoors
- On Tuesdays and Fridays, children should come to school wearing their PE kit to avoid the need to get changed. The children should wear their PE shorts and t-shirt and, most likely, a tracksuit (or jumper and joggers) over the top for colder weather. These must be dark coloured and plain. Children should wear trainers.
- Earrings must be removed and long hair tied up. Plasters are no longer acceptable to cover earrings in order to comply with Dudley Health and Safety Policy.



What to bring to school

- Full drinks bottle
- Healthy snack for morning break. This is really important as the morning session is very long and we are unable to provide fruit in Key Stage Two.
- Pupil planner needs to be in school every day
- Reading book
- A warm, waterproof coot with a hood

Reading Books



The children have now all chosen a book to take home within their coloured book band to read to an adult. Whenever they have finished it, they can bring it back to school to change it for a new book. Changing reading books is now the responsibility of each child.

* It is expected that every child reads their school book at home 3 days per week for at least 10 minutes. * Please write a short comment in their Pupil Planner each time your child reads at home.

Children who do this will receive a silver star in their planner.

We will listen to all children read in school regularly. The frequency of this depends on their own personal reading ability.

Maths Clubs

Once a week, the children will take part in a times tables clubs challenge (usually on a Wednesday), whereby they answer a set number of questions in 3 minutes. Children need to get all of the answers in their club correct for 3 consecutive weeks in order to move onto the next club. They will receive rewards for completing certain clubs.

The order of the clubs are as follows:

Club 27 (2,5 and 10 times tables) - 27 questions to be completed in 3 minutes. Bronze Badge award.

Club 40 (2,5,10,3,4 and 8 times tables) - 40 questions to be completed in 3 minutes. Silver Badge Award.

Club 55 (ALL tables) -55 questions to be completed in 3 minutes. Gold badge award.

Club 40 Division (2,5,10,3,4 and 8 times table division facts) — 40 questions to be completed in 3 minutes.

Club 55 Division (ALL division facts) - 55 questions to be completed in 3 minutes. Certificate and photo on school website/display. 100 Grid (ALL tables) - 100 questions to be completed in a grid format in 3 minutes. Shield trophy.

It is a government requirement that children know all their times tables by the end of year 4. Regular times tables practise at home will support your child with this. TT Rockstars is a great tool and fun way to practise!

Pupil Planners

Pupil planners will need to be brought to school <u>each day</u> as they contain information that the children may need in their lessons, such as times table charts and computer passwords.

This is where they also pop their gold and silver stars they earn for great behaviour and attitude to school!

Teachers will check planners each Monday. If your child has read 3 times during the week leading up to that Monday, they will be given their Silver Star on the special dated page.

Please note: these will only be given out on Mondays. They cannot be back-dated or given out the next day if the child forgets their planner.

Behaviour

Each class in school has a **Zone Board**.

Every morning, all children will see their names have been placed in the Green Zone. This is the good place! Every child in this zone is displaying good behaviour.

If your child shows a standard of behaviour above this level (maybe extra good concentration, contributing well in the lesson or being a caring friend), their name may be moved up to the Silver Zone! If they end their day here, they will receive a silver star in their Pupil Planner.

If your child continues to be amazing and really WOWs us, they may move up to the Gold Zone where they will receive a gold star if that is the place where they finish their day.

These gold and silver stars may be traded in for special rewards such as VIP Dining Experiences, a chair in assembly for the week, wearing their own clothes to school and more!

Behaviour

However, if the Green Zone good behaviour isn't being shown, your child's name may be moved down into the Amber Zone or even the Red Zone.

As teachers, we will look hard for positive improvements to try to move your child back into the Green Zone as soon as possible.

Unsortunately, is your child's name is placed into the Red Zone for continuing to display incorrect behaviour, they will need to miss some of their next playtime and not take part in the lovely activities planned for Golden Time on the Friday afternoon of that week.

- Our new approach to attendance is rooted in an inclusive attendance model designed to ensure that everyone our staff, families, and children - fully understands their individual roles and collective responsibilities in supporting school attendance, active engagement in learning, and addressing potential barriers

How to help at home

- Encourage your child to read as much as possible and discuss their reading with them, asking questions about what they have read.
- Practising times tables is very important. Little and often is the best way to embed learning tables. All children in Year 3 now have log-ins in their Pupil Planners for Times Table Rockstars which is a fantastic tool for practising times tables. The website is https://ttrockstars.com/
- · We also recommend that children practise telling the time at home on a regular basis.
