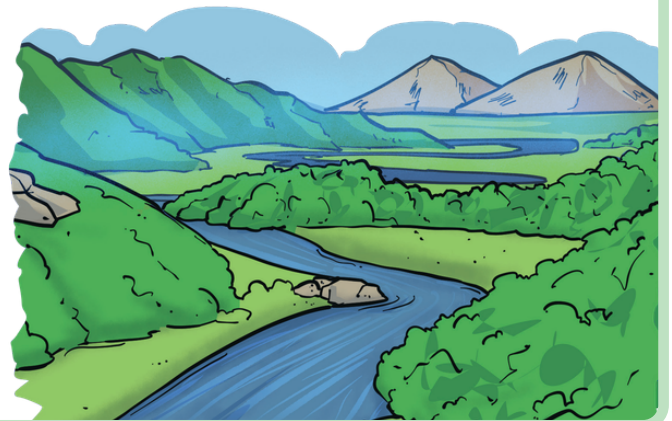


Rivers
